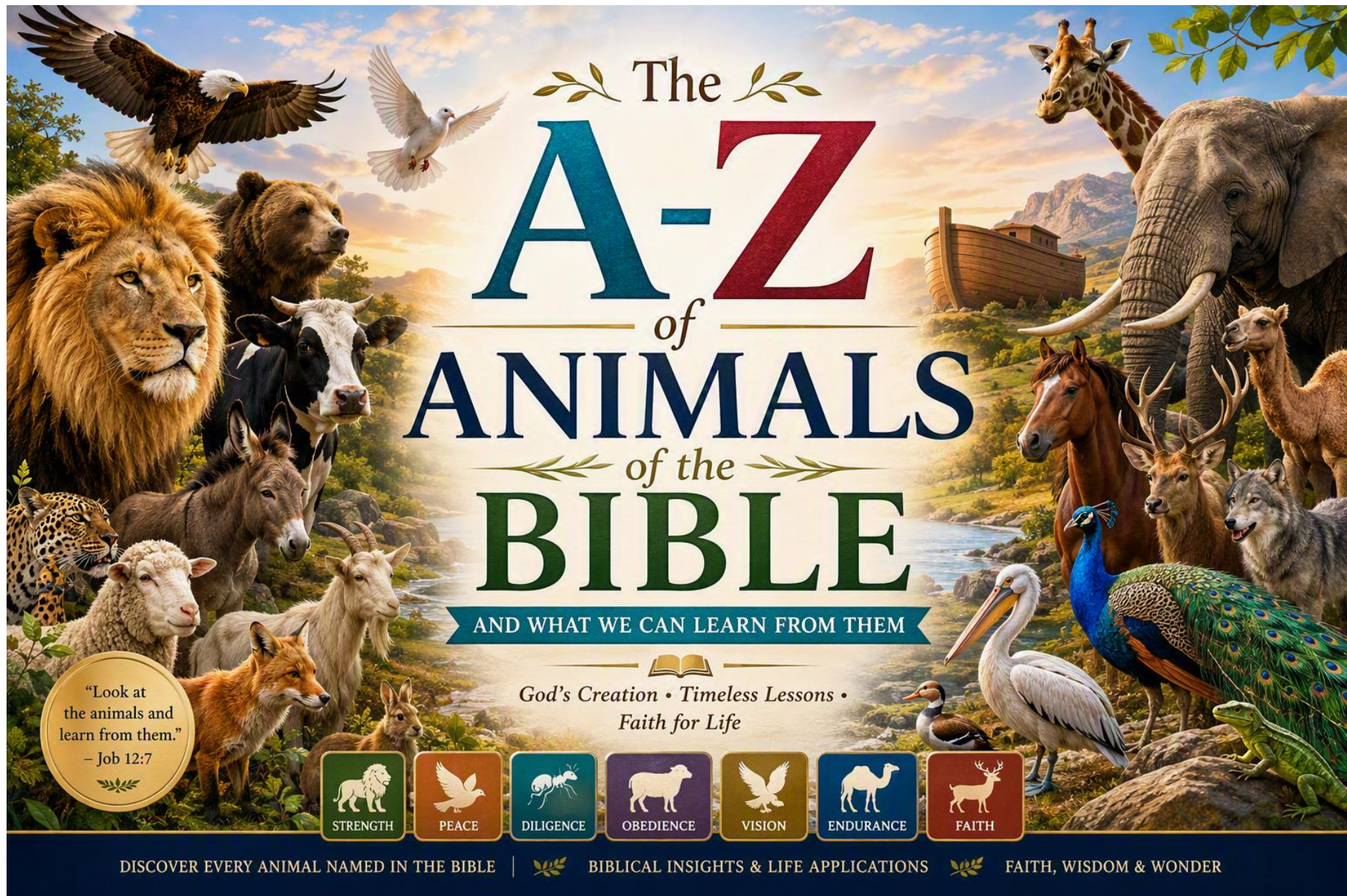

These are animals that are specifically named in the Protestant Bible. Some categories (like "fish") refer to groups that include many kinds beyond those pictured.

Mythical or fantastical creatures (such as Leviathan, Behemoth, Unicorn, Dragon, Seraphim, Cherubim, and others) are not included.

LESSONS WE CAN LEARN FROM ANIMALS IN THE BIBLE

“ Ask the animals, and they will teach you, or the birds in the sky, and they will tell you; or speak to the earth, and it will teach you...
JOB 12:7-8 (NIV) ”

God often used animals to teach powerful spiritual truths. Let's be teachable and grow wiser every day!



1 ANT – DILIGENCE Proverbs 6:6-8



Ants work hard and store food in season. We should be diligent, plan ahead, and not be lazy in our responsibilities.

2 DOVE – PEACE Matthew 3:16



The dove represents God's peace and the Holy Spirit. We are called to be peacemakers and live in harmony with others.

3 LION – COURAGE Daniel 6:22



Daniel trusted God in the lion's den. We can be courageous and faithful, knowing God protects those who trust Him.

4 RAVEN – PROVIDENCE 1 Kings 17:4-6



God sent ravens to feed Elijah. God sees our needs and provides in unexpected ways. We can trust His care every day.

5 LAMB – INNOCENCE John 1:29



Jesus is the Lamb of God, who takes away our sin. We are called to live pure, gentle, and obedient to God.

6 DONKEY – HUMILITY Numbers 22:21-30



The donkey was humble yet used by God to speak. God can use anyone willing to be obedient and humble.

7 FISH – OBEDIENCE Jonah 1:17



The great fish obeyed God and saved Jonah. We should be willing to obey God, even when it's difficult.

8 EAGLE – RENEWAL Isaiah 40:31



Like eagles, God gives us strength to rise above challenges. Wait on the Lord and He will renew your strength.

9 SHEEP – FOLLOWERSHIP John 10:27



Sheep listen to the shepherd's voice. We should listen to Jesus and follow Him faithfully every day.

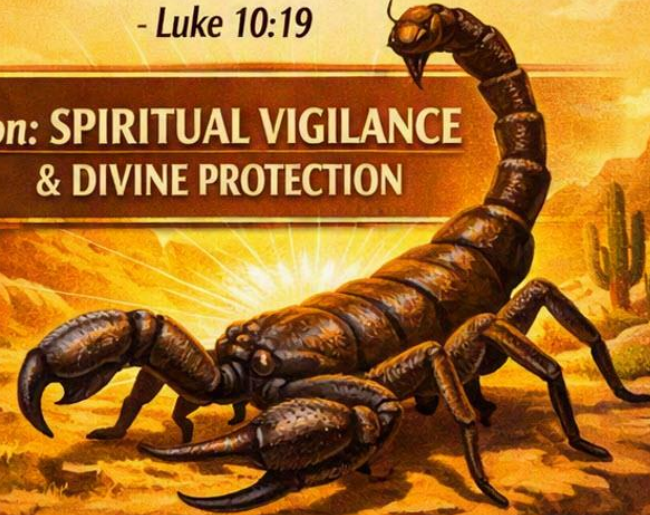

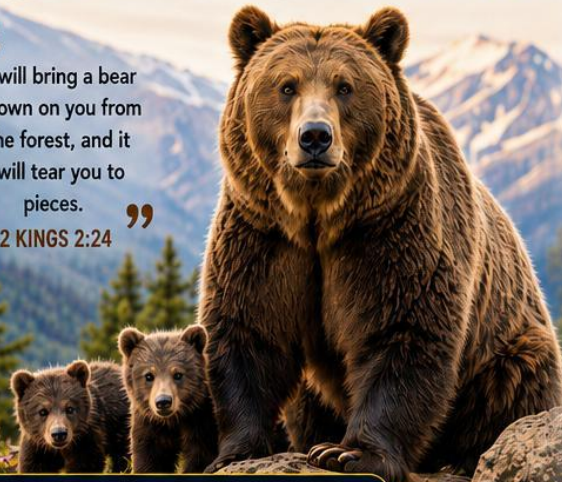
God uses even the strongest animals to accomplish His will and teach us *powerful spiritual truths.*

- Bees represent diligence, order, community, and the fruit of faithful work for God's provision and pleasure.

AMAZING FACTS ABOUT BULLS

- ✓ Bulls are incredibly strong—capable of pulling loads many times their own weight.
- ✓ They have excellent memory and can recognize people and places.
- ✓ Bulls are protective of their herd and will defend when necessary.
- ✓ They are naturally leaders among cattle.



Great strength is valuable, but godly strength is used to serve and honor God.



1 STRENGTH TO ACCOMPLISH
Deuteronomy 33:17

Bulls were known for their power and determination in pulling heavy loads.

WHAT WE LEARN:



God gives us strength to accomplish His plans.

2 WILLING TO SERVE
Judges 3:31

Eglon had three score sons riding on bulls, symbolizing service and work.

WHAT WE LEARN:



We are called to serve God and others humbly.

3 DEDICATED WORSHIP
1 Kings 12:28–32

Bulls were used in worship (sadly in idolatry) showing their value.

WHAT WE LEARN:



Worship God alone with a heart that is fully committed to Him.



BULLS IN THE BIBLE

- Judges 3:31
- 1 Kings 12:28, 32
- Job 39:9–12
- Psalm 22:12
- Isaiah 34:7
- Jeremiah 50:22
- Luke 15:24

4 USED FOR SACRIFICE
Leviticus 1:3

Bulls were offered in sacrifices as an atonement for sins.

WHAT WE LEARN:



Jesus is our ultimate sacrifice who takes away our sin.

5 POWER UNDER CONTROL
Job 39:9–10

God describes the bull's strength—but it obeys His command and is under control.

WHAT WE LEARN:



True strength is living under God's authority and guidance.

6 BE PRODUCTIVE AND FAITHFUL
Proverbs 14:4

A righteous person is compared to an ox—steady and productive.

WHAT WE LEARN:



Stay faithful and productive in all you do for God.

7 DO NOT TURN AWAY FROM INSTRUCTION
Proverbs 15:32

Discipline is like guiding an ox with a yoke—necessary and beneficial.

WHAT WE LEARN:



Accept God's discipline and instruction; it leads to wisdom.

8 GOD GIVES US THE VICTORY
Psalm 22:12

The Lord is compared to a strong bull who rescues and saves us.

WHAT WE LEARN:



Our strength and victory come from the Lord, not from ourselves.

9 STAY CALM IN DIFFICULT TIMES
Isaiah 34:7

Wild bulls symbolize nations in turmoil, but God is in control of all.

WHAT WE LEARN:



Trust God to be in control when life feels chaotic or uncertain.

10 CELEBRATE GOD'S PROVISION
Luke 15:24

The father killed the fatted calf to celebrate his son's return.

WHAT WE LEARN:



God rejoices over us and celebrates His grace and forgiveness.

APPLY THESE LESSONS EVERY DAY



Read God's Word and obey His instructions.



Seek God's strength in prayer daily.



Serve others with a willing and humble heart.



Stay faithful in small and big things.



Trust Jesus, our ultimate sacrifice.



Give God the glory in your victories.

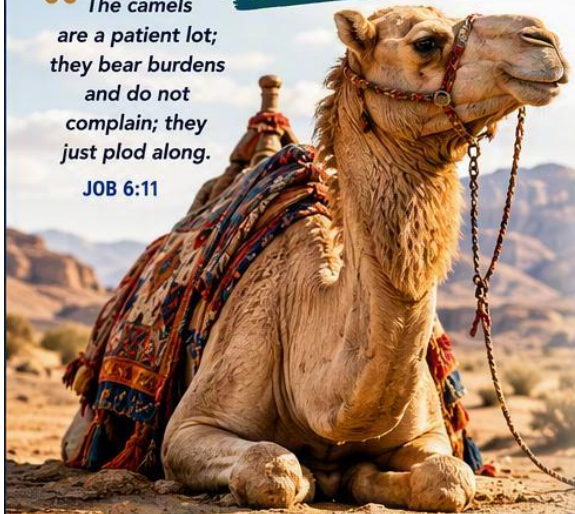

CAMELS IN THE BIBLE

1 ENDURANCE IN THE JOURNEY Job 6:11



Camels travel long distances through harsh conditions without giving up.

WHAT WE LEARN:
Stay faithful and keep going, even when the journey is difficult.

2 CAN CARRY HEAVY BURDENS Genesis 24:35



Camels carry heavy loads that help others reach their destination.

WHAT WE LEARN:
Be strong and willing to help others; our strength can be a blessing.

3 GOD PROVIDES THROUGH THEM Genesis 24:10–11



Rebekah was found because her camels were at the well—God used them.

WHAT WE LEARN:
God uses people and situations (even animals) to accomplish His plans.

4 PATIENCE AND STEADFASTNESS Job 39:9–12



Camels are calm, patient, and not easily agitated.

WHAT WE LEARN:
Cultivate patience and self-control in every situation.

5 BUILT FOR THE RIGHT PLACES Leviticus 11:4



Camels are made to thrive in the desert where others cannot.

WHAT WE LEARN:
God places us where we can use our gifts to make a difference.

6 HUMILITY AND SERVICE Matthew 19:30



Camels were used by kings and servants alike—both valued them.

WHAT WE LEARN:
Be humble and willing to serve, no matter your role.

7 DEPENDABLE AND FAITHFUL Genesis 24:40



Camels are reliable and return to the same paths and water sources.

WHAT WE LEARN:
Be faithful and trustworthy in your commitments.

8 CONTENT WITH WHAT THEY HAVE Deuteronomy 33:25



Camels are satisfied with what they need to survive and do their work.

WHAT WE LEARN:
Be content and grateful for what God provides.

9 A SIGN OF BLESSING AND PROVISION 1 Samuel 25:18



Camels often represented wealth, provision and blessings.

WHAT WE LEARN:
Trust God to supply all your needs abundantly.

10 POINT TO ETERNAL TREASURES Matthew 19:24



It is hard for a rich man to enter the Kingdom—harder than a camel through a needle.

WHAT WE LEARN:
Keep our hearts on eternal things, not earthly wealth.

APPLY THESE LESSONS EVERY DAY



Pray for endurance on your journey with God.



Look for ways to help and carry others' burdens.



Recognize and thank God for His provision.



Practice patience in challenging situations.



Walk in the calling God has placed in your life.



Serve with humility and a willing heart.



Be faithful in the little things every day.



Be content and trust God's timing.



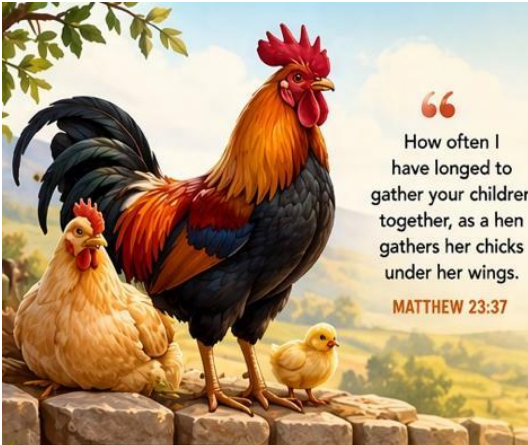

CHICKENS IN THE BIBLE

Chickens—hens, roosters and chicks—appear in Scripture in moments of prediction, denial, protection and provision. Their stories teach us powerful spiritual lessons for everyday life.

1 BE ALERT AND WATCHFUL



MATTHEW 26:34

The rooster's crow was a reminder for Peter to stay awake and faithful. Let's be spiritually alert and ready, not only in comfortable times but especially in trials.

2 OUR WORDS MATTER



MATTHEW 26:74

Peter denied Jesus before the rooster crowed. Be honest and faithful in your words. Integrity honors God.

3 GOD KNOWS AND CARES



MATTHEW 23:37

Jesus compared Himself to a hen who protects her chicks. God longs to protect and gather His people with love and compassion.

4 GOD PROVIDES EVEN IN SMALL WAYS



LUKE 13:34

Jesus lamented over Jerusalem, saying He wanted to gather her children "as a hen gathers her chicks." God desires to provide, nourish and keep His children close.

5 FIND FORGIVENESS AND RESTORATION



LUKE 22:61-62

After Peter wept, Jesus looked at him with love. No matter how far we fall, God offers grace, forgiveness and a fresh start.



WHAT CHICKENS TEACH US OVERALL



God is near and attentive to His children.



We are called to faithfulness and integrity.



God protects, provides and restores.



Humility and service reflect God's heart.

The deer seeks fresh, flowing water.

WHAT WE CAN LEARN:



Pursue God above everything else. He is our true refreshment.

3 AGILITY AND GRACE



Psalm 18:33
He makes my feet like the feet of a deer.

WHAT WE CAN LEARN:



God gives us agility to overcome challenges with grace.

4 ALERT AND SENSITIVE



Song of Solomon 2:9
The deer is alert to the voice of her lover.

WHAT WE CAN LEARN:



Be sensitive to God's voice and quick to respond in obedience.

5 STRENGTH IN TIMES OF TROUBLE



Habakkuk 3:19
He makes me as surefooted as a deer.

WHAT WE CAN LEARN:



Trust God to keep us steady and sure, even in difficult times.

6 LOOKING TO GOD ALONE



Psalm 42:2
The deer looks to the living God.

WHAT WE CAN LEARN:

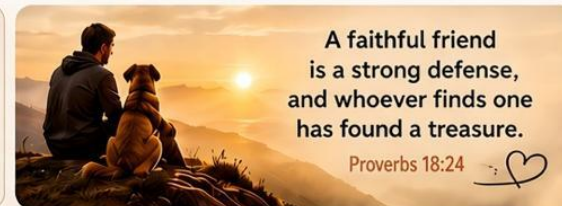

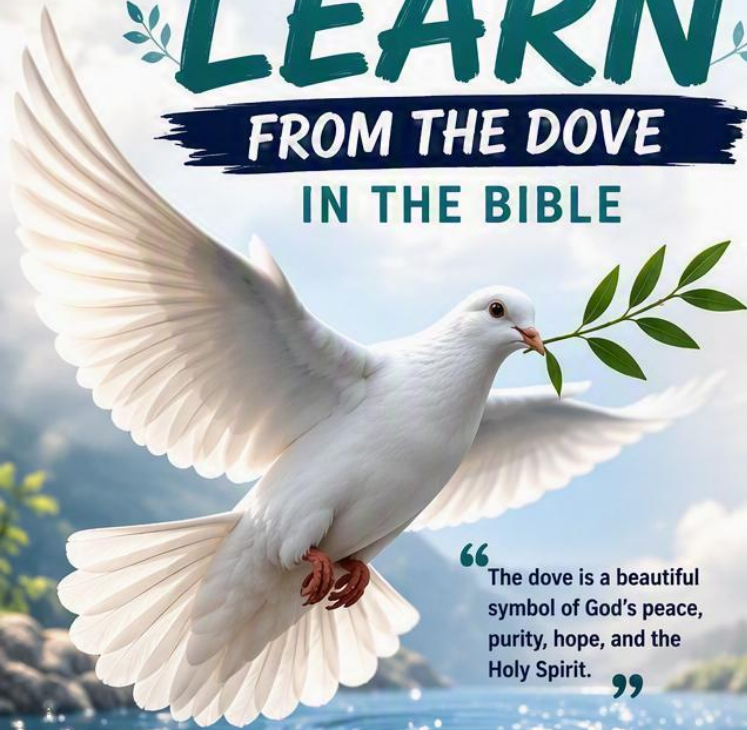

- The Song of Solomon mentions foxes that spoil the vineyards—a picture of small threats that cause big damage (Song 2:15).
- Foxes represent shrewdness, caution, and the danger of small but destructive influences.

1 BE AWARE OF SMALL THREATS

SONG OF SOLOMON 2:15

Foxes that spoil the vineyards show how small problems or compromises can ruin what God is building in our lives. Deal with little issues before they become big ones.

2 STAY FOCUSED ON YOUR CALLING

LUKE 9:59–62

Jesus said, “Foxes have dens and birds have nests, but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay his head.” Don’t let comfort or distractions pull you away from God’s mission.

3 DON’T LET SIN STEAL WHAT GOD BUILDS

SONG OF SOLOMON 2:15

Sin and bad influences can quietly destroy our relationships, joy, and purpose. Guard your heart and protect what God is cultivating in you.

4 DON’T FOLLOW WHERE GOD HASN’T SENT YOU

2 JOHN 1:9–11

Just as a fox can wander into danger, we can be led astray by false teachers or wrong paths. Stay rooted in God’s Word and truth.

WHAT FOXES TEACH US OVERALL

1 Be alert and protect what matters most.

Use wisdom and discernment in every season.

Stay committed to God’s calling above comfort.

Guard your heart from small sins and bad influences.

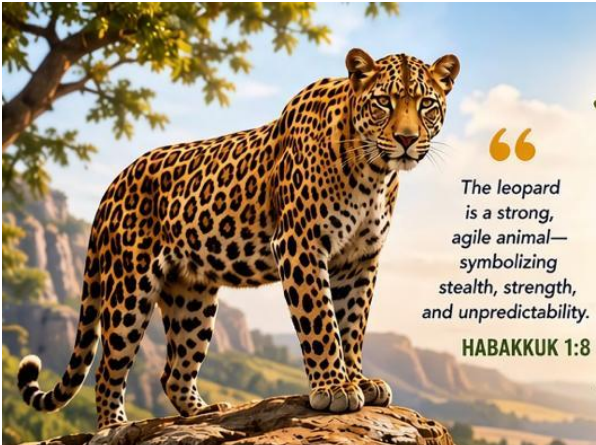

LEOPARDS IN THE BIBLE AT A GLANCE

- Leopards are mentioned multiple times in Scripture.
- They represent speed, fierceness, stealth, and danger.
- Used as imagery for proud kingdoms or enemies (Jeremiah 5:6; Lamentations 4:7).
- They remind us to be wise, watchful, and dependent on God’s protection.

1 STRENGTH SHOULD BE UNDER GOD’S CONTROL



PROVERBS 30:30

The leopard is powerful and feared, but even the strongest creatures are not above God’s rule.

Use your strength for good and for God’s glory.

2 STEALTH CAN LEAD TO DESTRUCTION WHEN USED FOR EVIL



HABAKKUK 1:8

Leopards move silently and strike unexpectedly—just like sin, which can trail us unnoticed.

Be alert and guard your heart. Watch how you live.

AMAZING FACTS ABOUT LOCUSTS

- Locusts can travel up to 150 km (93 miles) in a single day.
- A swarm can cover many square miles and contain billions.
- They eat their weight in food daily.
- They have powerful jumping legs and strong wings.



Powerful in numbers, but completely limited by God's hand.



In the Bible, locusts are used by God as a tool of **judgment** but also as a reminder of His **power, purpose,** and **mercy.** Let's learn from them!

Locusts in Revelation represent evil forces released for a season.

WHAT WE LEARN:

We must stand firm in faith and rely on God's protection.

10 TRUST GOD IN EVERY SEASON Habakkuk 1:6



Even when locusts come, God's plan and purposes remain.

WHAT WE LEARN:

Trust God—He is working even in seasons of loss or difficulty.

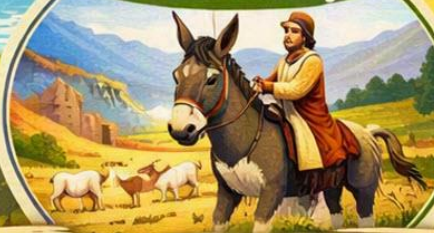

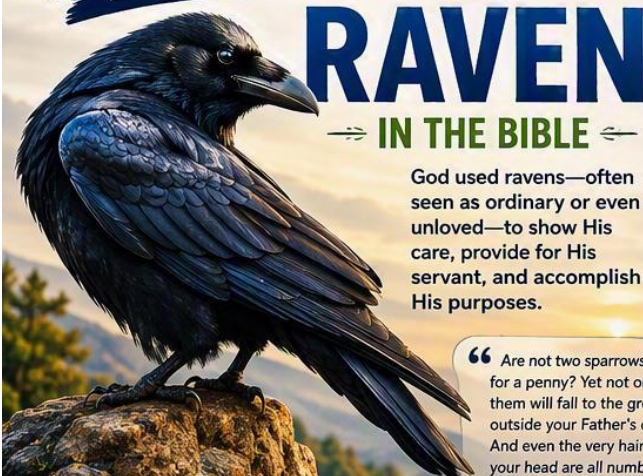

- Symbolize danger, judgment, and spiritual attacks from the enemy.
- Jesus gives authority over scorpions—reminding us of victory in His power.
- Call us to be wise, watchful, and dependent on God's protection.
- What God allows, He can control for our good and His glory.



1 SMALL BUT DANGEROUS



DEUTERONOMY 8:15

Scorpions are small, but their sting can be deadly. Sin and wrong choices may seem small, but they can bring great harm.

Never underestimate the danger of sin.

2 GOD PROVIDES PROTECTION



PSALM 91:13

God promises to protect us from danger. He is our refuge and strength, even in the face of hidden threats.

MATTHEW 10:29–31

Even the smallest sparrow is known and valued by God. He cares about what matters to us.

Rest in the assurance that God sees and cares for you.

2 WE ARE OF GREAT VALUE TO GOD



LUKE 12:6–7

Sparrows are worth something, yet God values you far more than many sparrows.

Know your worth. You are precious in God’s sight.

3 GOD WATCHES OVER US ALWAYS



PSALM 121:4

Just as God watches over sparrows, He watches over you—day and night.

Live with confidence knowing God never takes His eyes off you.

4 NOTHING HAPPENS WITHOUT GOD’S WILL



MATTHEW 10:29

Not a sparrow falls without God knowing—and your life is never out of His control.

Trust God’s sovereignty in every season of your life.

5 BE CONTENT WITH WHERE GOD PLACES YOU



MATTHEW 6:26

Sparrows don’t build large houses, yet God provides for them. We can be content with what we have.

Choose contentment and trust God to meet your needs.

1 CORINTHIANS 1:27

God often uses what the world considers small and weak to accomplish His powerful purposes.

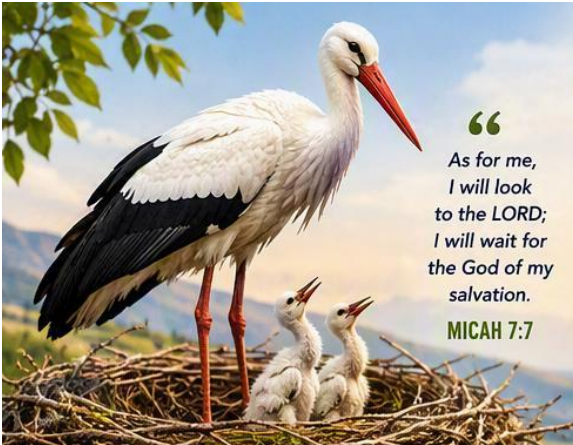
Don’t despise your small beginnings. God can use you!

- ✓ The stork knows its appointed times (Jeremiah 8:7), showing an awareness of seasons—teaching us about timing and trust in God’s plan.

1 FAITHFUL TO FAMILY AND YOUNG



JOB 39:13–17

Storks care for their young and are attentive to their needs. We are called to love, protect, and provide for our families.

 Be present. Be patient. Be faithful.

2 AWARE OF SEASONS AND TIMING



JEREMIAH 8:7

The stork knows when to come and go. We can trust God’s timing and be attentive to the seasons of our lives.

 Trust God’s timing and His perfect plan.

3 TRUST GOD AS OUR PROVIDER



PSALM 104:17–18

Storks rely on God to meet their needs as they journey. God is our Provider—He supplies all that we need.

 Cast your cares on God. He sees and provides.

4 MIGRATE WITH PURPOSE



PSALM 84:3

Storks migrate to the right place at the right time. We too are called to follow God’s direction and purpose.

 Follow God’s leading wherever He sends you.

5 CLEAN AND DISCERNING



LEVITICUS 11:19

Storks are listed among clean birds. Be discerning and set apart for God’s purposes in a world of compromise.

 Stay pure, stay set apart, stay obedient.

6 LOOK TO THE LORD AND WAIT



MICAH 7:7

Like the stork, we can wait hopefully on the Lord, knowing His faithfulness will never fail.

 Wait with hope. Trust in His promises.



WHAT STORKS TEACH US OVERALL

 Care for what God has entrusted to you.
  Be aware of seasons and trust His timing.
  Depend on God for provision and strength.
  Follow His leading and walk in His purpose.
  Live set apart with wisdom and discernment.
  Wait on the Lord and rest in His faithfulness.

Unity and strong leadership keep God’s people safe.

FROM WITHIN THE CHURCH Acts 20:29–30



Some wolves arise from among the leaders.



WHAT WE LEARN:
Stay alert and test every teaching by God’s Word.

JUDGMENT ON THE WICKED 2 Peter 2:1



God will judge those who exploit others.



WHAT WE LEARN:
God sees evil and will bring justice in His perfect timing.

TRUST IN THE GOOD SHEPHERD John 10:11



Jesus protects us from every wolf.

Rely on Jesus—He knows us, loves us, and lays down His life for us.

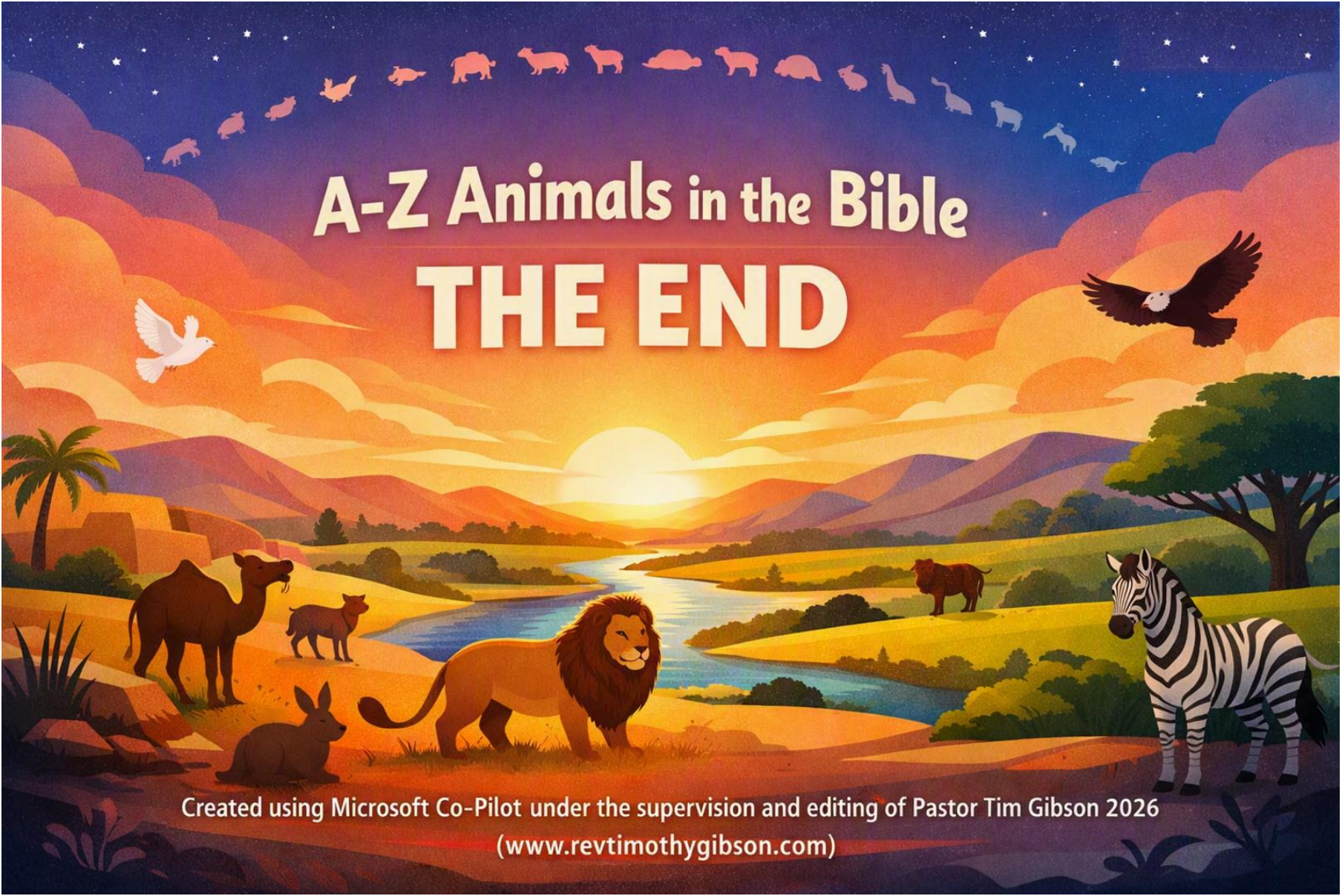
